DISCIPLINARY PROCEEDINGS

MOTION FOR BOARD'S FINAL ORDER BY HEARING NOT INVOLVING DISPUTED ISSUES OF MATERIAL FACT

1. Roderick Winston Medford, CRT, Case No: 2013-08587 (PCP, Nunez & Barrett)

Respondent was not present and nor represented by Counsel.

Ms. Sykes summarized the case for the Board. Respondent was charged with the following violations: **Count 1:** Section 468.365 (1)(m), Florida Statutes (2012), by accepting and performing professional responsibilities which license knows, or has reason to know, she or he is not competent to perform. **Count 2:** Section 468.365 (1)(v), Florida Statutes (2012), by performing professional services which have not been duly ordered by a physician licensed pursuant to chapter 458 or chapter 459 and which are not in accordance with protocols established by the hospital, other health care provider, or the board, except as provided in ss.743.064, 766.103, and 768.13, which constitutes grounds for disciplinary action by the Board of Respiratory Care. **Count 3:** Section 468.365 (1)(t), Florida Statutes (2012), by failing to keep written respiratory care records justifying the reason for the action taken by a licensee. **Count 4:** Section 468.365 (1)(f), Florida Statutes (2012), unprofessional conduct, which includes, but is not limited to any departure from, or failure to conform to, acceptable standards related to the delivery of respiratory care services, as set forth by the board in rules adopted pursuant to this part.

The case was presented as a Hearing Not Involving Disputed Issues of Material Fact, which requires the Board to impose whatever discipline upon the Respondent's license that the Board deems appropriated and to assess costs of the investigation.

Mr. Barnhart recommended this case be pulled and sent to Department of Administrative Hearings (DOAH), due to a corresponding letter received from Mr. Medford disputing the issues of material facts of this case.

MOTION: Dr. Friday-Stroud made a motion for the prosecuting attorney to send the case to DOAH. The motion was seconded by Mr. Frey and carried 5/0.

MOTION FOR BOARD'S FINAL ORDER BY HEARING NOT INVOLVING DISPUTED ISSUES OF MATERIAL FACT AND DETERMINATION OF RESPONDENT'S WAIVER OF RIGHT TO REQUEST A FORMAL HEARING

2. Ray Nelson, RCP., Case No: 2015-11126 (PCP, Garcia & Barrett)

Respondent was not present nor represented by Counsel.

Ms. Sykes summarized the case for the Board. Respondent was charged with the following violation: Section 458.365 (1)(i), Florida Statutes (2014), by violating a lawful order of the Board or Department previously entered in a disciplinary hearing.

The case was presented as a Hearing Not Involving Disputed Issues of Material Facts and determination of Respondent's waiver of right to request an informal hearing by default.

MOTION: Mr. Colon made a motion to accept the investigative report and exhibits into evidence for the purposes of imposing penalty. The motion was seconded by Dr. Friday-Stroud and carried 5/0.

MOTION: Dr. Friday-Stroud made a motion to find that the Respondent was properly served and has waived his right to a formal hearing. The motion was seconded by Mr. Colon and carried 5/0.

MOTION: Dr. Friday-Stroud made a motion to adopt the findings of fact and conclusions of Law as set forth in the Administrative Complaint and that this constitutes a violation of the Florida Statutes, as set forth in the Administrative Complaint. The motion was seconded by Mr. Colon and carried 5/0.

MOTION: After discussion, Mr. Colon made a motion to impose the following penalties:

- Respondent's license shall be suspended until he complies with the terms of the final Order entered in case number 2012-09965.
- Fine of \$2,000.00 to be paid within one year of the filing of the Final Order
- Costs of \$54.66 to be paid within one year of the filing of the Final Order

The motion was seconded by Dr. Friday-Stroud and carried 5/0.

3. Kayleigh Erin Elkins, RCP., Case No: 2015-26973(PCP, Garcia & Ludlow)

Respondent was not present nor represented by Counsel.

Ms. Sykes summarized the case for the Board. Respondent was charged with the following violations: **Count 1:** Section 458.365 (1)(g), Florida Statutes (2015), by engaging in the possession of a controlled substance without a legitimate purpose. **Count 2:** Section 458.365 (1)(w), Florida Statutes (2015) by being unable to deliver respiratory care services with reasonable skill and safety to patients.

The case was presented as a Hearing Not Involving Disputed Issues of Material Facts and determination of Respondent's waiver of right to request an informal hearing by default.

MOTION: Mr. Colon made a motion to accept the investigative report and exhibits into evidence for the purposes of imposing penalty. The motion was seconded by Mr. Frey and carried 5/0.

MOTION: Mr. Frey made a motion to find that the Respondent was properly served and has waived his right to a formal hearing. The motion was seconded by Mr. Colon and carried 5/0.

MOTION: Mr. Frey made a motion to adopt the findings of fact and conclusions of Law as set forth in the Administrative Complaint and that this constitutes a violation of the Florida Statutes, as set forth in the Administrative Complaint. The motion was seconded by Mr. Colon and carried 5/0.

MOTION: After discussion, Dr. Friday-Stroud made a motion to impose the following penalties:

- Respondent's license shall remain suspended until compliance with PRN and it is determined she is safe to practice.

- Fine of \$1,000.00 to be paid within one year of the filing of the Final Order

The motion was seconded by Mr. Frey and carried 5/0.

MOTION: Dr. Friday-Stroud made a motion to access the costs of \$1,631.53 to be paid within one year of the filing of the Final Order. The motion was seconded by Mr. Broeker and carried 5/0.

MOTION FOR BOARD'S FINAL ORDER BY SETTLEMENT AGREEMENT

4. Clive O'Brien McIntosh, CRT., Case No: 2015-28010 (PCP, Garcia & Fields)

Respondent was present, was represented by Nicole Becker Nicholson, Esquire and sworn in by the court reporter.

Ms. Sykes summarized the case for the Board. Respondent was charged with the following violations: **Count 1:** Section 468.365 (1)(x), Florida Statutes (2013), through a violation of Section 456.072 (1)(x), Florida Statutes(2013), by violating any provision of this chapter or chapter 456, or any rules adopted pursuant thereto, by failing to the pleas/convictions to the board or department within 30 days. **Count 2:** Section 468.365 (1)(x), Florida Statutes (2012), through a violation of Section 456.072 (1)(x), Florida Statutes(2012), by violating any provision of this chapter or chapter 456, or any rules adopted pursuant thereto, by failing to the pleas/convictions to the board or department within 30 days.

The case was presented as a Settlement Agreement that would impose the following penalties:

- Appearance
- Reprimand
- Fine of \$600.00 to be paid within 90 days of the filing of the Final Order
- Costs of \$1,082.51 to be paid within 90 days of the filing of the Final Order

Nicole Becker Nicholson was allowed to speak on the Respondent's behalf.

MOTION: After discussion, Dr. Friday-Stroud made a motion to accept the Settlement Agreement. The motion was seconded by Mr. Colon and carried 5/0.

MOTION FOR BOARD'S FINAL ORDER BY VOLUNTARY RELINQUISHMENT OF LICENSE

5. Cynthia L. Van Dixon, RRT., Case No: 2015-17783 (PCP, Garcia & Fields)

Respondent was not present nor represented by Counsel.

Ms. Sykes summarized the case for the Board. Respondent was charged with the following violation: Section 468.365 (1)(w), Florida Statutes,(2014) by being unable to deliver respiratory care services with reasonable skill and safety to patients by reason of illness or use of alcohol, drugs, narcotics, chemicals, or any other type of material as a result of any mental or physical condition.

The case was presented as a motion of Board's Final Order by Voluntary Relinquishment.

MOTION: After discussion, Dr. Friday-Stroud moved to accept the Voluntary Relinquishment. The motion was seconded by Mr. Frey and carried 5/0.

6. Aaron Dean Bishop, RRT., Case No: 2016-00298 (PCP, N/A)

Respondent was not present nor represented by Counsel.

Ms. Sykes summarized the case for the Board. Respondent was charged with the following violations: Section 468.072 (1)(k)(z)(aa)(dd) and 468.365 (1)(f)(l)(w)(x) Florida Statutes.

The case was presented as a motion of Board's Final Order by Voluntary Relinquishment.

MOTION: After discussion, Dr. Friday-Stroud moved to accept the Voluntary Relinquishment. The motion was seconded by Mr. Broeker and carried 5/0.

7. David Garcia, CRT., Case No: 2016-10064 (PCP, Waived)

Respondent was not present nor represented by Counsel.

Ms. Sykes summarized the case for the Board. Respondent was charged with the following violation: Section 456.072 (1)(k)(z)(dd) & 468.315(1)(w)(x), Florida Statutes.

The case was presented as a motion of Board's Final Order by Voluntary Relinquishment.

MOTION: After discussion, Dr. Friday-Stroud moved to accept the Voluntary Relinquishment. The motion was seconded by Mr. Frey and carried 5/0.

Of the 32 open cases, 9 are in the Emergency Action Unit (EAU). Of the 23 cases in the Allied Section, All are assigned to me, 5 have been downgraded from EAU, 7 are new since the last Prosecutor's Report, 1 is awaiting expert review, 2 are awaiting supplemental materials, 5 are agendaed for a PCP meeting scheduled for today (06/21/16), and 5 have been agendaed for the 08/16/16 PCP meeting.

MOTION: Dr. Friday-Stroud made a motion to allow prosecution to continue prosecuting year old cases. The motion was seconded by Mr. Frey and carried 5/0.

ADMINISTRATIVE PROCEEDINGS

PERSONAL APPEARANCE PURSUANT TO §456.013(3)(c), F.S.

9. Keri Roche, Registered Respiratory Therapist

Ms. Roche was present and sworn in by the court reporter.

She was requested to appear before the board due to the "yes" answer in the criminal and disciplinary history sections of her application.

MOTION: After discussion, Dr. Friday-Stroud made a motion to grant licensure with no conditions. The motion was seconded by Mr. Frey and carried 5/0.

10. Tricia Jane Winter, Registered Respiratory Therapist

Ms. Winter was present and sworn in by the court reporter.

She was requested to appear before the board due to the "yes" answer in the criminal history section of her application.

MOTION: After discussion, Mr. Colon made a motion to grant licensure with the following conditions:

- Applicant shall make contact with the Florida Professionals Resource Network (PRN) within 30 days, undergo an evaluation coordinated by PRN within 60 days of the filing of the Order and if recommended, comply with any and all terms or conditions imposed by PRN within 90 days of the filing of the Order as a result of said evaluation.
- Staff may issue license if PRN deems applicant safe to practice.

The motion was seconded by Dr. Friday-Stroud and carried 5/0.

Dr. Jean D' Aprix was present on behalf of the Professionals Resource Network (PRN) and gave a brief overview of what the PRN program entails.

MOTION: Mr. Colon made a motion that the application shall be denied, if the applicant does not meet or fail to comply with requirements recommended. The motion was seconded by Mr. Frey and carried 5/0.

11. Deepak Sukumar, Registered Respiratory Therapist

Mr. Sukumar was present and sworn in by the court reporter.

He was requested to appear before the board due to the "yes" answer in the criminal history section of his application.

MOTION: After discussion, Mr. Colon made a motion to grant licensure with no conditions. The motion was seconded by Dr. Friday-Stroud and carried 5/0.

12. Gregory Albert, Registered Respiratory Therapist

Mr. Albert was present and sworn in by the court reporter.

He was requested to appear before the board due to the "yes" answer in the criminal and disciplinary history sections of his application.

MOTION: After discussion, Mr. Colon made a motion to deny licensure due to Mr. Albert practicing on a delinquent license. The motion was seconded by Mr. Mitchell. The motion did not carry. Motion failed.

MOTION: After further discussion, Mr. Frey made a motion to grant licensure with the following conditions:

- Staff confirms that Mr. Albert was not practicing on a delinquent license in January of 2013, otherwise Mr. Albert's license shall be denied.

The motion was seconded by Dr. Friday-Stroud and carried 3/2. Mr. Colon and Mr. Mitchell opposed.

APPLICANT RATIFICATION LISTS

MOTION: Mr. Colon made a motion to ratify the list of 36 names, beginning with Shannon Baham and ending with Jimmy Wambles for CRT licensure by endorsement. The motion was seconded by Mr. Broeker and carried 5/0.

MOTION: Mr. Colon made a motion to ratify the list of 220 names, beginning with Babak Madhat and ending with Angelique Parisa McLean for RRT licensure by endorsement. The motion was seconded by Mr. Broeker and carried 5/0.

15. Continuing Education Providers

MOTION: Mr. Frey made a motion to ratify the 2 names, for CE providership, beginning with LAST Minute CEU's and ending with Select Specialty Hospital. The motion was seconded by Mr. Broeker and carried 5/0.

REQUEST FOR CONSIDERATION OF EXEMPTION FOR DISQUALIFICATION FROM EMPLOYMENT

26. David Andrew Binczak, TT6554

Mr. Binczak was not present nor represented by Counsel.

He has submitted an application for Exemption from Disqualification to seek employment in a health care facility licensed under Chapter 400, Florida Statutes.

MOTION: After discussion, Mr. Frey made a motion to grant Mr. Binczak's request for an Employment Exemption from Disqualification. The motion was seconded by Mr. Mitchell and carried 5/0.

16. Exemption From Disqualification Ratification List

MOTION: Mr. Frey made a motion to ratify the one name, Darlene Marie Bailey, for exemption for disqualification from employment by delegation of authority from the Board for staff to administratively review and approve exemption applications that meet certain criteria. The motion was seconded by Dr. Friday-Stroud and carried 5/0.

NEW BUSINESS

17. Survey Review

During the April 8, 2016 Respiratory Care General Business meeting, the Board discussed developing a strategic plan.

On April 29, 2016 the Board held a conference call to discuss potential questions for an online survey. Several questions were provided to be considered. Mr. Colon has provided the final draft of the questions for review.

Mr. Colon provided a brief overview of the survey and decided it is premature, however, would like to see more updates on the respiratory care website. Staff mentioned there is an Active

Campaign program that's being implemented by the Department, which is a more efficient way of corresponding with the licensees or public, with updates for the profession.

This item was tabled until the October meeting for more discussion regarding the progress on the Active Campaign.

18. Lakeland Regional Hospital Presentation

Rodney Bevis, Director, Respiratory Care Services & Intermediate Care Unit (IMCU) for Lakeland Regional Hospital gave a detailed discussion regarding the program being used at their facility to help educate and promote smoking cessation.

19. American Lung Association Presentation

Ms. Janell Ridding was present on behalf of the American Lung Association and gave a brief overview of the Association, and their involvement with the promotion of lung health.

RULE DISCUSSION AND/OR DEVELOPMENT

20. 64B32-6.001, F.A.C., Continuing Education Requirement

- Smoking Cessation Continuing Education Requirement

During the April 8, 2016 meeting, the Board voted to require a mandatory continuing education course on smoking cessation. Included in this tab was:

- Rule language for 64B32-6001 Continuing Education Requirement
- Information from Ms. Amy Cober, RD LD MPH CTTS, which includes, a flyer on the nationally accredited 3 day Tobacco Treatment Specialist training offered by the FSU College of Medicine AHEC.

Comments from the audience were considered regarding the verbiage of the title Smoking Cessation.

MOTION: After discussion Dr. Friday-Stroud made a motion to amend the language of the course title to Tobacco Treatment. The motion was seconded by Mr. Colon and carried 5/0.

64B32-6.001 Continuing Education Requirement.

(1) The Legislature and the Board have determined that competency in delivery of respiratory care services is enhanced by continuous updating of knowledge and skills. To this end, continuing education is required as a condition for renewal of licensure of all respiratory care licensees.

(2) Each licensee shall submit proof satisfactory to the Board of participation in appropriate continuing education. During each biennium, as established by the Department, each licensee must earn 24 hours of continuing education credit including those earned as provided in this rule. None of these hours can be obtained by taking Basic Life Support (BLS) training. No more than five (5) hours per biennium shall be awarded for completion of courses focusing on risk management.

(3) Those persons initially licensed during the second year of a biennium are exempt from the continuing education requirements, except for the Medical Errors course and HIV/AIDS course and the Florida laws and rules

course, pursuant to subsection (5) of this rule, for their first renewal. Continuing education requirements must be met for each biennium thereafter.

(4) A licensee who holds a current license as a Certified Respiratory Therapist (CRT) or holds a current license in another health care profession may satisfy the continuing education requirement for issuance of the Registered Respiratory Therapist (RRT) or renewal of the CRT license with hours counted toward renewal of another license as long as the hours meet all the requirements of this rule chapter.

(5) A licensee may be required to earn continuing education credit hours which include the following:

- (a) Florida laws and rules Mandatory for all licensees: 2 credit hours pursuant to subsection 64B32-6.001(5), F.A.C. Licensees may earn up to 8 continuing education hours per biennium by attending meetings of the Board of Respiration Care, but no more than 2 of those hours will be credited to satisfying the Florida laws and rules requirement.
- (b) Prevention of Medical Errors Mandatory for all licensees: 2 hours in a board-approved continuing education course pursuant to Rule 64B32-6.006, F.A.C.
- (c) HIV/AIDS Mandatory for the initial renewal of all licensees, optional for subsequent renewals: At least 3 hours but no more than 5 hours pursuant to Rule 64B32-6.006, F.A.C. The course must be taken within the last five (5) years prior to either initial licensure or first renewal. Licensees may complete up to 5 hours of continuing education credited to HIV/AIDS education, although any completed hours in excess of the required 3 hours will be counted as continuing education credits.

(d) Tobacco Treatment Mandatory for all licensees: 1 hour per biennium, beginning with the biennium ending May 31, 2019.

~~(e)~~ Other requirements that satisfy continuing education are listed in Rule 64B32-6.004, F.A.C.

(6) No licensee will be given more than the credited hours of completion of any continuing education course, as credited for completion of the course once, per biennium, regardless of the number of times a licensee registers for and completes a course.

MOTION: Dr. Friday-Stroud made a motion that amending the language of the course title is a technical change therefore no SERC list would be needed. The motion was seconded by Mr. Colon and carried 5/0.
