DISCIPLINARY PROCEEDINGS

Due to participation in the Probable Cause Panel, Mr. Mitchell was recused from tabs 1, 22 and 23.

MOTION FOR DETERMINATION OF WAIVER AND FINAL ORDER BY HEARING NOT INVOLVING DISPUTED ISSUES OF MATERIAL FACT

1. Veronica Barrett, RRT., Case No: 2018-2018-15209 (PCP, Mitchell and Sherrod)

Respondent was not present nor represented by Counsel.

Ms. Prescott summarized the case for the Board. Respondent was charged with the following violations: Section 468.365 (1)(x), Florida Statutes (2017) through a violation of Section 456.072(1) (aa), Florida Statutes (2017), for testing positive for any drug, as defined in s.112.0455, on any confirmed preemployment or employer ordered drug screening when the practitioner does not have a lawful prescription.

The case was presented as a Hearing Not Involving Disputed Issues of Material Facts and determination of Respondent's waiver of right to request an informal hearing by default.

MOTION: Dr. Friday-Stroud made a motion to accept the investigative report and exhibits into evidence for the purposes of imposing penalty, making a finding that the Respondent was properly served and has waived his right to a formal hearing, adopted the findings of fact that is set forth in the Administrative Complaint. The motion was seconded by Ms. Hom and carried 4/0.

MOTION: Dr. Friday-Stroud made a motion to adopt the conclusions of Law as set forth in the Administrative Complaint and that this constitutes a violation of the Practice Act. The motion was seconded by Ms. Hom and carried 4/0.

MOTION: After discussion Dr. Friday-Stroud made a motion to impose the following penalties:

- The Respondent's license to practice respiratory care in the State of Florida is hereby SUSPENDED until such time as he demonstrates the ability to practice respiratory care with reasonable skill and safety. Such demonstration of skill and safety shall include an evaluation by the Professionals Resource Network (PRN).
- The Respondent shall appear before the Board with said PRN evaluation and the Board shall make the determination of whether Respondent is safe to practice respiratory care with reasonable skill and safety. The Board retains jurisdiction in this matter to impose terms and conditions upon reinstatement of Respondent's license.

MOTION: Ms. Hom made a motion to access the costs of \$950.58 to be paid within one year of the filing of the Final Order. The motion was seconded by Ms. Hom and carried 4/0.

22. William Royce Harrison, RRT., Case No: 2018- 07624 (PCP, Mitchell & Barrett)

Respondent was not present nor represented by Counsel.

Ms. Prescott summarized the case for the Board. Respondent was charged with the following violations: Section 456.072(1) (hh), Florida Statutes (2017), being terminated from PRN monitoring program, for failing to comply, without good cause, complete terms of the PRN contract entered into.

The case was presented as a Hearing Not Involving Disputed Issues of Material Facts and determination of Respondent's waiver of right to request an informal hearing by default.

MOTION: Ms. Hom made a motion to accept the investigative report and exhibits into evidence for the purposes of imposing penalty, making a finding that the Respondent was properly served and has waived his right to a formal hearing, adopted the findings of fact that is set forth in the Administrative Complaint. The motion was seconded by Mr. Garcia and carried 4/0.

MOTION: Ms. Hom made a motion to adopt the conclusions of Law as set forth in the Administrative Complaint and that this constitutes a violation of the Practice Act. The motion was seconded by Mr. Garcia and carried 4/0.

MOTION: After discussion, Ms. Hom made a motion to impose the following penalty:

- The Respondent's license to practice respiratory care in the State of Florida is hereby **SUSPENDED** until such time as he demonstrates the ability to practice respiratory care with reasonable skill and safety. Mr. Garcia seconded the motion.

Ms. Hom rescinded the recommended motion to suspend the Respondent's license until such time as he demonstrates the ability to practice respiratory care with reasonable skill and safety.

Dr. Friday-Stroud made a new motion to impose the following penalty:

- Revocation of Respondent's license.

The motion was seconded by Mr. Garcia and carried 4/0.

The cost for this case was withdrawn by the prosecution attorney.

23. Juan Miguel Moreno, RRT., Case No: 2018- 19311 (PCP, Mitchell & Sherrod)

Respondent was present and sworn in by the court reporter.

Ms. Prescott summarized the case for the Board. Respondent was charged with the following violation: Section 468.365 (1)(x), Florida Statutes (2001-2018) through a violation of Section 456.072(1) (k), Florida Statutes (2001-2018), for failure to pay student loan obligation.

The case was presented as a Hearing Not Involving Disputed Issues of Material Facts and determination of Respondent's waiver of right to request an informal hearing by default.

MOTION: Dr. Friday-Stroud made a motion to accept the investigative report and exhibits into evidence for the purposes of imposing penalty, making a finding that the Respondent was properly served and has waived his right to a formal hearing, adopted the findings of fact that is set forth in the Administrative Complaint. The motion was seconded by Mr. Hom and carried 4/0.

The Respondent was present and was allow the opportunity to address the Board regarding his student loan.

MOTION: After discussion, Ms. Frey made a motion to impose the following penalties:

- Respondent shall pay an administrative fine of 1,798.00 which is 10% of the defaulted loan, to be paid within three (3) years of the filing of the Final Order.
- Respondent's respiratory care license shall be placed on probation during the duration of the student loan obligation and he shall make biannual progress reports to the Department of Health Compliance Services Unit.

The motion was seconded by Dr. Friday-Stroud and carried 4/0.

MOTION: Dr. Friday made a motion to access costs of \$457.94 to be paid within three (3) years of the filing of the Final Order. The motion was seconded by Ms. Hom and carried 4/0.

3. Michael Edward Bianchi, Registered Respiratory Therapist

Mr. Bianchi was not present nor represented by Counsel.

Mr. Bianchi sent a statement stating he would not be able to make this meeting and asked the Board to table his application until the next regularly scheduled meeting to allow him the chance to be attend the meeting.

He was required to appear before the board due to the "yes" answer in the criminal history section of his application.

MOTION: After discussion, Mr. Mitchell made a motion to grant licensure with no conditions. The motion was seconded by Dr. Friday-Stroud and carried 5/0.

4. Cheryl Pender, Registered Respiratory Therapist

Ms. Pender was not present nor represented by Counsel.

She was required to appear before the board due to the “yes” answer in the disciplinary history section of her application.

MOTION: After discussion, Mr. Mitchell made a motion to table this case and request Ms. Pender appearance at the next regularly scheduled meeting. The motion was seconded by Ms. Hom and carried 5/0.

5. James Saunders, Certified Respiratory Therapist

Mr. Saunders was present and sworn in by the court reporter.

He was required to appear before the board due to the “yes” answer in the criminal history and discipline sections of his application.

MOTION: After discussion, Mr. Frey made a motion to grant licensure with the following conditions:

- Applicant shall make contact with the Florida Professionals Resource Network (PRN) within 30 days, undergo an evaluation coordinated by PRN within 60 days of the filing of the Order and if recommended, comply with any and all terms or conditions imposed by PRN within 90 days of the filing of the Order as a result of said evaluation. Staff may proceed with licensure if PRN deems applicant safe to practice.
- Comply with the terms of previous Final Order issued in DOH Case# 2011-09841.
- If applicant does not comply with the imposed conditions, the application will be denied.

The motion was seconded by Ms. Hom and carried 4/1. Mr. Mitchell opposed.

24. Jeremy Jay Williams, Registered Respiratory Therapist

Mr. Williams was present and sworn in by the court reporter.

He was required to appear before the board due to the “yes” answer in the criminal and discipline history sections of his application.

MOTION: After discussion, Dr. Friday-Stroud made a motion to grant licensure with no conditions. The motion was seconded by Mr. Frey and carried 5/0.
